CITY OF LAWRENCEVILLE, ILLINOIS <u>APRIL 10, 2025</u> <u>MINUTES</u>

The Council of the City of Lawrenceville, Lawrence County, Illinois met in regular session in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall Building on Thursday, April 10, 2025 at the hour of 7:00 p.m. The following Aldermen were present on roll call: Brewer, Dunn, Fritch, Greene, Waldrop and Goins. Absent: Stevens, Volkman.

Mayor Courtney called the meeting to order. Waldrop gave the prayer. All present then recited the Pledge of Allegiance while facing the flag.

The Council had earlier received copies of the minutes of the regular Council meeting of March, 2025. Mayor Courtney asked for questions or comments. Dunn motioned to approve the minutes of the meeting of February, 2025. Goins seconded the motion. Motion passed on a voice vote.

Council had earlier received copies of the bills of the City's Sewer and Water Departments for March, 2025. Mayor Courtney asked for questions or comments. Brewer made a motion to approve paying the bills for March, 2025. Greene seconded the motion. Motion passed on a roll call vote 6-0. Yeas: Fritch, Brewer, Greene, Waldrop, Dunn and Goins. Nays: None. Absent: Stevens, Volkman.

Mayor Courtney reported the City's accounts to the Council. The city working budget is on line after 11 months of the 24-25 fiscal year.

Resident Louie Campbell wanted clarification following a conversation with Dunn concerning the proposed construction of a wastewater treatment plant. Campbell disputed observations made by Dunn, and Campbell felt the conversation highlighted a deeper concern over the proposed site. Campbell pushed the idea of a site northwest of the city on privately owned farm ground.

Resident Kelly Lewis stated she was aware of residents in Ward I who experienced significant issues with flooding in yards and storm sewer issues in basements. While she acknowledged this was a significant rainfall earlier this month, she said a problem also exists with moderate rainfall. Mayor Courtney indicated the City is preliminarily working on a project to line city sewer system in Lincoln Heights, which would help alleviate issues elsewhere in town.

In regards to canvassing the general election held April 1, the Mayor announced the following results while reminding everyone these results wouldn't be finalized until April 14:

Resident Victoria Shinkle is working with City officials to promote a community day, and she was in search of City representation on a board directing the effort. Brewer volunteered, and Lewis will also join after she's sworn in May.

The mayor asked for a motion to review executive session minutes from the previous year. Dunn motioned. Brewer seconded. Time: 7:16 p.m.

The Council returned from Executive Session: 7:25 p.m.

Mayor Courtney advised the Council the owners of old Lawrenceville High School were ordered to remediate the site within 60 days in Lawrence County Circuit Court on March 21. It's unknown if they will ask for an extension. The Council has shown interest in the site as a future location for the state-mandated wastewater treatment plant, following advice from HMG Engineering Group.

After reviewing data and feedback from other Council members, the Street & Alley Committee recommended any consideration for the use of slow-speed vehicles (golf carts) within the city limits to not include ATVs, such as side by sides. The committee also recommended to allow golf carts to be used on James Street, if the proposal receives Council approval. Also suggested was the requirement for a driver's license, \$50 fee for first-time registration and \$25 renewal fee. The registration would be for the vehicle, not the driver. All potential drivers of a vehicle would have to be listed on the permit application for the vehicle with a signed liability release to exempt the City from any loss.

Chief White reported officer Nick Earnst completed K9 handling classes. K-9 officer Lucian isn't trained to locate cannabis, because it's a legal substance in Illinois. Body-worn cameras have been in operation since before the start of 2025. White said the formation of a search warrant team has been considered and would likely need additional medical training. The Police Commission sent recommendations for candidates to fill an opening for patrolman.

The Mayor met with Taegan Garner of Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission concerning the 16th Street waterline project. There's likely an update coming within 60 days. The City is also working with Greater Wabash concerning lining sanitary sewers in Lincoln Heights to curtail the flow of infiltration that overloads the rest of the City's system during hard rains.

The street department created a list for possible street improvements with a budget of roughly \$125,000 to \$140,00. The suggestions were: Sunny Lane from 23rd Street to Lincoln Drive; one

block of Third Street; a portion of Charles Street; Ladner Lane; an alley between State and Jefferson; and Christy from 17th Street to Porter Ave. Courtney asked the council members to submit a list of any other streets to consider.

Goins requested the City to inform residents of Ordinance 32-1-11, which requires the removal of election signage seven days following an election. Brewer indicated CDs came up for renewal in June. The Finance Committee will meet with White, the newly elected Treasurer. Waldrop thanked Shinkle for her effort with the community activity.

The target date for the teardown on the house at 503 11th is April 28. The high school fire science class will train in the building before the teardown.

Wreaths Across America will host a spaghetti fundraiser at Alphonso's on April 15. The Easter Egg Hunt is set for April 19 at the City Park. The Lawrence County CEO Trade Show is April 27 at The Armory. The Downtown Music Fest sponsored by Downtown Revitalization is May 24 on 12th Street, featuring Adam Warner and Richard Goodall.

The City received a note of thanks from Kids Shopping Day another note from the Lawrenceville Craft Club for fostering creativity within the community.

The next Council meeting is May 8, when new the Council will be sworn into office.

Brewer motioned to adjourn. Greene seconded. Time: 7:38.
